About the Program

The Producers Program, established in 1984, primes its students to become the industry's next leading creative producers and executives. Over a course of two years, students immerse themselves in curricula highlighting development, financing, distribution, and strategy, emphasizing both storytelling and reaching audiences across diverse media. Given its intimate class size, the program can tailor mentorship to every student's unique aspirations and interests, united by a shared passion for storytelling, excellence, and humanistic values. Graduates include studio heads, acclaimed producers, and influential figures in entertainment.

All MFA programs in Film, Television, & Digital Media are FULL-TIME programs. The Department admits new students only once each year for the Fall Quarter.

Applicants must submit all required application materials to be considered for admission.

ONLINE AND MAILED APPLICATION DEADLINE: NOVEMBER 1, 2024

Important Information

The information and supplemental materials must be uploaded and mailed by **Friday**, **November 1**, **2024** (11:59pm PST).

Make sure you review all categories before you submit your UCLA Application for Graduate Admission. You may log in/log out of the system as many times as needed during the filing period, but once the application is submitted, you will not be able to make **ANY** corrections or additions.

Payment and final submission of the online application are required for a COMPLETE application.

MFA Applicants

By the time of entrance, MUST:

- Have at least a 3.0 GPA.
- Satisfy the University of California's Graduate Admission Requirements.
- Complete equivalent to a 4 year US Bachelor's Degree.

<u>ONLINE</u>

The following materials must be completed online.

Check Once Completed:

- Complete the UCLA Application for Graduate Admission.
 - **Complete all required information.**
 - Indicate MFA, FILM AND TEVEVISION, and PRODUCERS PROGRAM as your program.
 - □ Upload UNOFFICAL Transcripts.
 - Submit <u>Three</u> LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION.
 Enter the Names and Emails of all recommenders.
 - □ Upload a STATEMENT OF PURPOSE.
 - Upload a PERSONAL STATEMENT.
 - Upload a RESUME.
 - □ Upload a PORTFOLIO OF TWO ORIGINAL TREATMENTS.
 - □ Upload the PRODUCERS PROGRAM QUESTIONNAIRE.
 - □ Upload ADDITIONAL MATERIALS. (Optional)
 - Pay the APPLICATION FEE and then complete the FINAL SUBMISSION on the application.

<u>MAIL</u>

The following hard-copy materials **MUST** be sent by mail. This is in addition to the online materials. (Transcripts and Test Scores can arrive separately if needed.)

Check Once Completed:

□ Mail OFFICIAL copies of TRANSCRIPTS.

□ Mail OFFICIAL TEST SCORES. (Not required for all applicants)

ONLINE AND MAILED APPLICATION DEADLINE: November 1, 2024

Applicants MUST complete BOTH the Online and Mail portions of the application to be considered.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS GUIDELINES

Step 1: Online

- Complete the UCLA Application for Graduate Admission.
 - MUST be paid and completed <u>ONLINE</u> BY **NOVEMBER 1, 2024.**
 - o Indicate MFA as the Degree,
 - FILM AND TELEVISION as the Major,
 - PRODUCERS PROGRAM as the Area.
 - AREA selection will be on the FILM & TELEVISION page of the <u>UCLA</u> <u>Application for Graduate Admission</u>.
 - Upload a STATEMENT OF PURPOSE.
 - Give the faculty a sense of who you are. What do you hope to achieve by participating in the program? What are your professional goals? How do you plan to achieve them?

 - Upload a PERSONAL STATEMENT.

- <u>SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS</u>.

When applicable, Supplemental Materials must be uploaded in PDF Format, 12 point font, double-spaced, use 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ by 11 page size, and not exceed the indicated page maximum. If you do not follow these guidelines, your application will not be considered. Also include your name, title of the piece, and page number on each page.

- Upload a RESUME.
- Upload a PORTFOLIO of TWO ORIGINAL TREATMENTS.
 - Each TREATMENT should not exceed **3-page max**.
 - TREATMENTS can be either Feature Film and/or Television Treatments.
 - Feature Film Treatment may include: title, logline, genre, and story synopsis.
 - Television Treatment may include: title, logline, genre, premise, short character description of major characters, and a brief synopsis of pilot episode.
 - Original treatments only. NO ADAPTATIONS.
 - Please do not send scripts.
- Upload the PRODUCERS PROGRAMS QUESTIONNAIRE.
 - Answer the following THREE prompts (1/2 page max each prompt).
 - Why specifically do you want to attend the UCLA Producers Program?
 - What two to three qualities do you most admire in people you consider role models?
 - Briefly describe a specific difficult or stressful situation where you helped solve a problem with collaborators.

• Upload the ADDITONAL MATERIALS. (Optional)

- Submit a LINK to visual work.
 - Work should accurately reflect your production experience and creative sensibilities.
 - Indicate the role you played in the production.
 - Total materials submitted should not exceed <u>10 min max</u>.
 - Materials MUST be in English or subtitled in English.
 - ONLY YouTube and Vimeo links accepted.
 - DO NOT PASSWORD PROTECT VIDEO LINKS.
- Upload UNOFFICIAL copies of all TRANSCRIPTS.
 - Upload PDF copies of all Undergraduate and Graduate institutions attended.
 - Many institutions allow access to records online, where students can print or save unofficial copies.
 - If you have hard copies of transcripts, you can scan and save the documents as PDF files.
 - <u>NOTE: Community College transcripts are not necessary, as the coursework</u> will be reflected on the undergraduate transcript.
- Submit <u>Three</u> LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION.
 - Enter the Names and Emails of all recommenders.
 - Recommenders will be sent an automated email with instructions on submitting letters once submitted.
 - Letters should be from individuals who know you well: a teacher, an employer, or someone in a position of leadership or responsibility with substantial knowledge of your personal qualities and capabilities. Avoid asking family friends and/or prominent public figures who may not know you as well as a teacher or employer. You want to find those who can honestly tell us what is unique, remarkable, and admirable about you and your abilities, based upon their personal experience. Do not submit more than three letters of recommendation.

Step 2: Mail

- Mail an OFFICIAL <u>PAPER</u> copy of all TRANSCRIPTS from each Undergraduate and Graduate institutions attended.
 - NOTE: Community College transcripts are not necessary, as the coursework will be reflected on the undergraduate transcript.
 - Please have transcripts sent to the address below or include them in sealed envelopes with the supplemental application packet.
- Request that all TEST SCORES be sent directly to UCLA.
 - Only test scores taken by **December 31, 2024** will be accepted.
 - The GRE UCLA Code is 4837 and the Department Code is 2409.
 - NOTE: THE GRE IS NOT REQUIRED FOR MFA APPLICANTS.

International Students

English Proficiency: Any international applicant whose first language is not English must certify proficiency in English when applying to UCLA, and, if admitted, upon arrival. Such applicants must submit scores received on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) as part of their application. The UCLA Code is 4837 and the Department Code is 2409. Only test scores taken by **December 31, 2024** will be accepted. For more information, visit https://grad.ucla.edu/admissions/english-requirements/. International applicants who have received a Bachelor's degree from an American institution are not required to take the TOEFL.

<u>Academic Records</u>: Although the UCLA Graduate Division Application enables applicants to upload an unofficial copy of their academic records, all applicants are required to submit official records from each academic institution attended. <u>Undergraduate Degree Requirement</u>: Applicants must complete equivalent to a 4 year US Bachelor's Degree. International students who hold three-year ordinary pass degrees, or who hold professional diplomas in accounting, business, librarianship, social work, physical education, health education and so on, or four-year degrees, diplomas or higher certificates from technical, vocational or post-secondary specialized schools are **NOT** eligible for graduate admission. Proof of Funding for Visa: U.S. immigration law requires that international applicants, if admitted, show documented evidence that sufficient funds to cover all tuition, fees, transportation, and living expenses are available for the first year of their studies at UCLA. This must be proven before a Certificate of Eligibility (I-20 or DS2019) for a visa can be issued. FAFSA

DREAM Act

For non-US Citizens or non-Permanent Residents who are approved to pay in-state tuition because they graduated from a high school in California; they will need to complete the California DREAM application by the March 2, 2025 deadline.
