About the Program

The two-year Master of Fine Arts degree program allows students to focus on either feature film or television writing, with opportunities to explore workshops in both areas. Throughout their studies, students are guided by faculty members actively involved in the film, television, and new media sectors, benefiting from their extensive professional experience. We challenge our students to succeed through risking failure, to engage with other art forms in order to better understand the art of screenwriting, to cultivate a curiosity in global art, to develop critical thinking skills to aid in the analysis of their scripts, and to provide an ethical foundation in building a career path.

All MFA programs in Film, Television, & Digital Media are FULL-TIME programs. The Department admits new students only once each year for the Fall Quarter.

We do not accept Films, DVDs, or Links.

Applicants must submit all required application materials to be considered for admission.

ONLINE AND MAILED APPLICATION DEADLINE: NOVEMBER 1, 2024

Important Information

The information and supplemental materials must be uploaded and mailed by **Friday, November 1, 2024 (11:59pm PST)**.

Make sure you review all categories before you submit your UCLA Application for Graduate Admission. You may log in/log out of the system as many times as needed during the filing period, but once the application is submitted, you will not be able to make **ANY** corrections or additions.

Payment and final submission of the online application are required for a COMPLETE application.

MFA Applicants

By the time of entrance, **MUST:**

- Have at least a 3.0 GPA.
 - Satisfy the University of California's [Graduate Admission Requirements](#).
 - Complete equivalent to a 4 year US Bachelor's Degree.

APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Use this checklist to help prepare your materials. This information **MUST** be electronically submitted online AND sent by mail as indicated. More detailed information on these materials will be included in the following pages of this document. **This is NOT an application, it is only to be used as a checklist.**

ONLINE

The following materials must be completed online.

Check Once Completed:

- Complete the [UCLA Application for Graduate Admission](#).
 - Complete all required information.
 - Indicate MFA, FILM AND TELEVISION, and SCREENWRITING as your program.
 - Indicate either FEATURE FILM or TELEVISION within SCREENWRITING.
 - Upload UNOFFICIAL Transcripts.
 - Submit Three LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION.
 - Enter the Names and Emails of all recommenders.
 - Upload a STATEMENT OF PURPOSE.
 - Upload a PERSONAL STATEMENT.
 - Upload a track specific CREATIVE PORTFOLIO.
 - Pay the APPLICATION FEE and then complete the FINAL SUBMISSION on the application.
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MAIL

The following hard-copy materials **MUST** be sent by mail. This is in addition to the online materials. (Transcripts and Test Scores can arrive separately if needed.)

Check Once Completed:

- Mail OFFICIAL copies of TRANSCRIPTS.
 - Mail OFFICIAL TEST SCORES. *(Not required for all applicants)*
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ONLINE AND MAILED APPLICATION DEADLINE: November 1, 2024

Applicants MUST complete BOTH the Online and Mail portions of the application to be considered.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS GUIDELINES

Step 1: Online

- Complete the [UCLA Application for Graduate Admission](#).
 - MUST be paid and completed ONLINE BY **NOVEMBER 1, 2024**.
 - Indicate MFA as the Degree,
 - FILM AND TELEVISION as the Major,
 - SCREENWRITING as the Area, indicating either FEATURE FILM or TELEVISION.
 - AREA selection will be on the FILM & TELEVISION page of the [UCLA Application for Graduate Admission](#).
 - Upload a STATEMENT OF PURPOSE.
 - Please be sure to address why you wish to attend the UCLA MFA Screenwriting program specifically, and what it is you hope to learn by pursuing an MFA in screenwriting. Please provide a narrative history of your writing experience thus far, with an emphasis on narrative screenwriting (television, feature film, digital media).

- SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS.

When applicable, materials should be uploaded in PDF Format, 12 point font, use 8 ½ by 11 page size, and not exceed the indicated page maximum. If possible, also include your name, title of the piece, and page number on each page.

- Upload a CREATIVE PORTFOLIO.
 - Submit **ONLY** materials, in script format, for the selected TRACK:
 - **Feature Film Track:**
 - TWO completed FEATURE-LENGTH SCREENPLAYS (80-130 page max).
 - **Television Track:**
Submit ONE of the following options:
 - TWO ORIGINAL hour-long DRAMA PILOTS (each 50-65 page max).
 - TWO ORIGINAL half-hour COMEDY/DRAMEDY PILOTS (each 40 page max).
 - ONE ORIGINAL hour-long DRAMA PILOT (50-65 page max) & ONE ORIGINAL half-hour COMEDY/DRAMEDY PILOT (40 page max).
 - **DO NOT** submit adaptations, spec episode scripts or co-written materials, these will **NOT** be reviewed.
 - **DO NOT** submit any other form of writing, including poems, novels, short fiction, essays; these will **NOT** be reviewed.

SCREENWRITING APPLICATION WORKSHEET

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- Upload UNOFFICIAL copies of all TRANSCRIPTS.
 - Upload PDF copies of all Undergraduate and Graduate institutions attended.
 - Many institutions allow access to records online, where students can print or save unofficial copies.
 - If you have hard copies of transcripts, you can scan and save the documents as PDF files.
 - NOTE: Community College transcripts are not necessary, as the coursework will be reflected on the undergraduate transcript.

- Submit Three LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION.
 - Enter the Names and Emails of all recommenders.
 - Recommenders will be sent an automated email with instructions on submitting letters once submitted.
 - *Letters should be from individuals who know you well: a teacher, an employer, or someone in a position of leadership or responsibility with substantial knowledge of your personal qualities and capabilities. Avoid asking family friends and/or prominent public figures who may not know you as well as a teacher or employer. You want to find those who can honestly tell us what is unique, remarkable, and admirable about you and your abilities, based upon their personal experience. Do not submit more than three letters of recommendation.*

Step 2: Mail

- Mail an OFFICIAL PAPER copy of all TRANSCRIPTS from each Undergraduate and Graduate institutions attended.
 - NOTE: Community College transcripts are not necessary, as the coursework will be reflected on the undergraduate transcript.
 - Please have transcripts sent to the address below or include them in sealed envelopes with the supplemental application packet.
- Request that all TEST SCORES be sent directly to UCLA.
 - Only test scores taken by **December 31, 2024** will be accepted.
 - The GRE UCLA Code is 4837 and the Department Code is 2409.
 - **NOTE: THE GRE IS NOT REQUIRED FOR MFA APPLICANTS.**

International Students

English Proficiency: Any international applicant whose first language is not English must certify proficiency in English when applying to UCLA, and, if admitted, upon arrival. Such applicants must submit scores received on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) as part of their application. The UCLA Code is 4837 and the Department Code is 2409. Only test scores taken by **December 31, 2024** will be accepted. International applicants who have received a Bachelor's degree from an American institution are not required to take the TOEFL.

Academic Records: Although the UCLA Graduate Division Application enables applicants to upload an unofficial copy of their academic records, all applicants are required to submit official records from each academic institution attended. Undergraduate Degree Requirement: Applicants must complete equivalent to a 4 year US Bachelor's Degree. International students who hold three-year ordinary pass degrees, or who hold professional diplomas in accounting, business, librarianship, social work, physical education, health education and so on, or four-year degrees, diplomas or higher certificates from technical, vocational or post-secondary specialized schools are **NOT** eligible for graduate admission. Proof of Funding for Visa: U.S. immigration law requires that international applicants, if admitted, show documented evidence that sufficient funds to cover all tuition, fees, transportation, and living expenses are available for the first year of their studies at UCLA. This must be proven before a Certificate of Eligibility (I-20 or DS2019) for a visa can be issued. FAFSA
