About the Program

For current UCLA students, the Bachelor of Arts in Film and Television is a two year, upper division program for those who have completed two years of general college studies. The Department of Film, Television, & Digital Media (FTVDM) admits new students only once each year for the Fall Quarter.

About Applications

Together, all of the application materials will provide the admissions committee a clear and compelling picture of who you are. The application materials should include your significant life experiences, your most important personal traits and greatest strengths, your special creative talents, your values and goals in life, and your vision for the kind of work you hope to pursue.

An applicant should demonstrate a strong liberal arts and humanistic education, exceptional literacy, outstanding communication skills, and unique creative ability. Prior experience in film and television is not required.

We do not accept Films, DVDs, or Links.

Applicants must submit all required application materials to be considered for admission.

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Important Information

The information and supplemental materials must be uploaded to the TFT Undergraduate Supplemental Application website using your UC Application ID# by Monday, January 13, 2025 (11:59pm PST). This is a strict deadline, please plan ahead to avoid any unexpected, last minute delays.

The supplemental application must be fully completed and uploaded online before your application to the UCLA Department of Film, Television, and Digital Media will be reviewed. Late, incomplete, or hard-copy applications will not be considered.

Review all categories before submitting your supplemental application. Applicants may log in/log out of the system as many times as needed during the filing period, but once submitted, no corrections or additions can be made to the application.

Change of Major Applicants

By the time of entrance, MUST:

- Have at least a 3.2 GPA.
- Enroll at UCLA in Winter and Spring Quarters of the current academic year.
- Complete a minimum of 90 and not exceed a maximum of 135 quarter units of coursework.
- Complete ONE of the following General Education Plans:
 - o UCLA School of Theater, Film and Television GE Requirements.
 - o Another UCLA Major GE Requirements.

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APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS GUIDELINES

Step 1: Online Application

- Complete the <u>UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM CHANGE PETITION</u>.
- Complete the UNDERGRADUATE FTVDM SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION.
 - MUST be completed <u>ONLINE</u> by **JANUARY 13, 2025.**
 - Email <u>filmundergrad@tft.ucla.edu</u> with your Name and UID to receive a <u>Fee</u> <u>Waiver Code</u> before submitting the application.
 - Complete Contact Information

Supplemental Materials.

All Supplemental Materials must be uploaded in PDF Format (10MB max), double-spaced, 12-point font, use 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ by 11 page size, and not exceed the indicated page maximum. If you do not follow these guidelines, your application will not be considered.

- Personal Essay (2 page max).
 - The personal essay should include a summary of your background, creative interests, academic and professional goals. The personal essay may include unusual life experiences, important influences in your life, your motivation to study film and television, and the kind of creative work you hope to pursue. Do not use the personal essay to flatter us; use these few pages to create a very personal and vivid picture of yourself, what is most important to you, and your creative and professional goals.
- Life Challenge Essay (2 page max).
 - Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement? Things to consider: A challenge could be personal, or something you have faced in your community or school. Why was the challenge significant to you? This is a good opportunity to talk about any obstacles you've faced and what you've learned from the experience. Did you have support from someone else or did you handle it alone? If you're currently working your way through a challenge, what are you doing now, and does that affect different aspects of your life? For example, ask yourself, "How has my life changed at home, at my school, with my friends, or with my family?"

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- Critical Essay (3 page max).
 - The critical essay is your analysis of a film or television program. This essay is NOT a review. You should assume the reader has seen the work you are discussing; do not include a plot summary. This essay is similar to what you would write in an English literature or film history course. It is your analysis of any aspect(s) of the work you have selected: the use of design, composition, color, lighting, sound, etc. as it relates to social observation or commentary, moral or philosophical elements, psychological aspects or relationships of the characters, dramatic structure, etc.
- Creative Writing (5 page max).
 - You may submit any one kind or combination of creative writing: a short story, a film treatment, a storyboard, a script or play excerpt (including a short synopsis of the complete script), etc. Those interested in submitting poetry, photographs, and/or drawings must submit one other type of creative work. The total of all submitted creative writing combined cannot exceed the 5 page maximum. No preference is given to one type of creative work over another. DO NOT SUBMIT FILMS, DVDS, or CDS.
- Submit <u>Two</u> LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION.
 - Enter the Names and Emails of all recommenders into <u>UNDERGRADUATE FTVDM</u>
 <u>SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION</u>.
 - Recommenders will be sent an automated email with instructions on submitting letters once the Supplemental Application has been submitted.
 - Letters should be from individuals who know you well: a teacher, an employer, or someone in a position of leadership or responsibility with substantial knowledge of your personal qualities and capabilities. Avoid asking family, friends, and/or prominent public figures who may not know you as well as a teacher or employer. You want to find those who can best tell us what is unique, remarkable, and admirable about you and your abilities, based upon their personal experience. Do not submit more than two letters of recommendation.
- Submit Academic Records.
 - Upload UNOFFICIAL copies of UCLA TRANSCRIPTS.
 - o Indicate your Current Cumulative GPA.

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FAFSA
