Film and Television BA Program

About the Program

For first-years, the Bachelor of Arts in Film and Television is a four-year program consisting primarily of two years of general college studies and two years of major coursework. The Department of Film, Television, & Digital Media (FTVDM) admits new students only once each year for the Fall Quarter.

About Applications

Together, all of the application materials will provide the admissions committee a clear and compelling picture of who you are. The application materials should include your significant life experiences, your most important personal traits and greatest strengths, your special creative talents, your values and goals in life, and your vision for the kind of work you hope to pursue.

An applicant should demonstrate a strong liberal arts and humanistic education, exceptional literacy, outstanding communication skills, and unique creative ability. Prior experience in film and television is not required.

We do not accept Films, DVDs, or Links.

Applicants must submit all required application materials to be considered for admission.

UC APPLICATION DEADLINE: DECEMBER 2, 2024

FIRST-YEAR SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION DEADLINE: DECEMBER 9, 2024

Important Information

The information and supplemental materials must be uploaded to the TFT Undergraduate Supplemental Application website using your UC Application ID# by Monday, December 9, 2024 (11:59pm PST). This is a strict deadline, please plan ahead to avoid any unexpected, last minute delays.

The supplemental application must be fully completed and uploaded online before your application to the UCLA Department of Film, Television, and Digital Media will be reviewed. Late, incomplete, or hard-copy applications will not be considered.

Review all categories before submitting your supplemental application. Applicants may log in/log out of the system as many times as needed during the filing period, but once submitted, no corrections or additions can be made to the application.

First-Year Applicants

By the time of entrance, MUST:

- Have at least a 3.0 GPA (CA Residents).
 - or
- 3.4 GPA (Non-CA Residents).
- Satisfy the University of California's General First-Year Admission Requirements.

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APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS GUIDELINES

Step 1: UC Application

- Complete the <u>University of California Application for Undergraduate</u> Admission.
 - o MUST be completed ONLINE OCTOBER 1 DECEMBER 2, 2024.
 - o Indicate FILM AND TELEVISION as the FIRST Choice major.

Step 2: Supplemental Application

- Basic Information.
 - Complete the <u>Undergraduate FTVDM Supplemental Application</u>.
 - A supplemental application fee of \$50 will be required.
 - o MUST be completed ONLINE by **DECEMBER 9, 2025.**
 - Create an account with Acceptd.
 - Note: This is not the same login used for the UC Application.
 - Complete Application Information.
 - Please note that the UC Application ID# received from submitting the UC Application is required.
 - Select the Areas of Interest within FTVDM.
 - Optional Information:
 - Awards/Honors/Exhibitions/Internships/Experience
 - Relevant Extracurricular Activities
 - Resume of relevant experience, if applicable (2 page max)
- Academic Information.
 - Upload UNOFFICIAL copies of all TRANSCRIPTS.
 - Upload PDF copies of all high school and college transcripts, if applicable.
 - Many institutions allow access to records online, where students can print or save unofficial copies.
 - If you have hard copies of transcripts, you can scan and save the documents as PDF files.
 - Submit current CUMULATIVE GPA.
 - Include Unweighted and, if applicable, Weighted GPA.
 - Academic History:
 - Schools you have attended (beginning with the most recent)
 - Courses currently in progress
 - Courses planned for spring and/or summer
- Supplemental Materials.

All Supplemental Materials must be uploaded in PDF Format (10MB max), double-spaced, 12-point font, use 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ by 11 page size, and not exceed the indicated page maximum. If you do not follow these guidelines, your application will not be considered.

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- Personal Essay (2 page max).
 - The personal essay should include a summary of your background, creative interests, academic and professional goals. The personal essay may include unusual life experiences, important influences in your life, your motivation to study film and television, and the kind of creative work you hope to pursue. Do not use the personal essay to flatter us; use these few pages to create a very personal and vivid picture of yourself, what is most important to you, and your creative and professional goals.
- Life Challenge Essay (2 page max).
 - Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement? Things to consider: A challenge could be personal, or something you have faced in your community or school. Why was the challenge significant to you? This is a good opportunity to talk about any obstacles you've faced and what you've learned from the experience. Did you have support from someone else or did you handle it alone? If you're currently working your way through a challenge, what are you doing now, and does that affect different aspects of your life? For example, ask yourself, "How has my life changed at home, at my school, with my friends, or with my family?" Please Note: This question is identical to optional Question #5 on the UC Application.
- Writing Sample.
 - Critical Essay (3 page max).
 - The critical essay is your analysis of a film or television program. This essay is NOT a review. You should assume the reader has seen the work you are discussing; do not include a plot summary. This essay is similar to what you would write in an English literature or film history course. It is your analysis of any aspect(s) of the work you have selected: the use of design, composition, color, lighting, sound, etc. as it relates to social observation or commentary, moral or philosophical elements, psychological aspects or relationships of the characters, dramatic structure, etc.

<u>OR</u>

- Creative Writing (5 page max).
 - You may submit any one kind or combination of creative writing: a short story, a film treatment, a storyboard, a script or play excerpt (including a short synopsis of the complete script), etc. Those interested in submitting poetry, photographs, and/or drawings must submit one other type of creative work. The total of all submitted creative writing combined cannot exceed the 5 page maximum. No preference is given to one type of creative work over another. DO NOT SUBMIT FILMS, DVDS, or CDS.

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- Submit Two LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION.
 - Enter the Names and Emails of all recommenders into <u>UNDERGRADUATE FTVDM</u>
 SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION.
 - Recommenders will be sent an automated email with instructions on submitting letters once the Supplemental Application has been submitted.
 - Letters should be from individuals who know you well: a teacher, an employer, or someone in a position of leadership or responsibility with substantial knowledge of your personal qualities and capabilities. Avoid asking family, friends, and/or prominent public figures who may not know you as well as a teacher or employer. You want to find those who can best tell us what is unique, remarkable, and admirable about you and your abilities, based upon their personal experience. Do not submit more than two letters of recommendation.
