
distance and proximity, a critical as well as an emotional understanding that does not rely on the creation of any form of individual subjectivity."

CERTIFIED FRESH: TOM NUNAN'S NEW FEATURE FILM HITS THEATERS





TFT FACULTY AND ALUMNI COLLABORATE ON THE LITTLE KING OF NORWALK



CHRISTIAN BARILLAS TO DIRECT NEW MUSICAL IN 2026

Christian Barillas will direct *Lilly and the Pirates*, a new musical by Will Eno, John Maclay, and Brett Ryback, at Orlando Family Stage (Feb–Mar 2026). *Lilly and the Pirates* is an epic adventure filled with swashbuckling humor, clever wordplay, and unexpected heart. It's a story about bravery, self-discovery and love of family, with a sweeping musical score. It's also a joyful ode to libraries and the importance of access to books.

KRISTY GUEVARA-FLANAGAN'S BODY PARTS LAUNCHES EDUCATIONAL DISTRIBUTION

Kristy Guevara-Flanagan's feature documentary *Body Parts* launched its educational distribution with Media Education Foundation, accompanied by a new study guide. Praised as a "fantastic primer" on Hollywood's representations of women, the film acts as a crash course of the on-screen history of sex and women's agency.





FELIPE CERVERA BRINGS PERFORMANCE TO SPACE WITH GRANT; COMMITTEE


Felipe Cervera was awarded a new UCLA Global Research Award seed grant. The project is titled Imagining Space Otherwise, and its aim is to assemble an international working group to research contemporary arts, with a special emphasis on the performing arts and the space industry.

Partners include leading scholars from the Universities of Toronto, Manchester, Utrecht, Iberoamericana, and Western Sydney.

Additionally, In July 2025, Cervera was elected a voting member of the Committee for the Cultural Utilization of Outer Space at the International Astronautical Federation (ITACCUS / IAF). This committee gathers industry leaders, artists, and academics from around the world to discuss the cultural implications of space exploration. The committee formulates frameworks to define and protect heritage in space and on the Moon, and proposes initiatives to international bodies to foster critical and cultural perspectives on and in the space industry.

SYLVAN OSWALD DIVES INTO CREATIVE PROJECTS WHILE ON SABBATICAL

Sylvan Oswald, Professor in Playwriting, is on sabbatical writing the libretto of Untitled Feminist Sci-Fi Musical, a collaboration with composer/lyricist Tova Katz in preparation for a workshop through the Dean's Innovation Fund. While he is away, Sylvan is an artist-in-residence at Bard College's Center for Human Rights and the Arts. Over the summer, Sylvan's play *Pony* was published by Northwestern University Press and featured in the annual reading series Pride Plays (NYC) with readings in NYC at MCC Theater and in DC at Woolly Mammoth. Both readings were directed by Will Davis, Artistic Director of



Rattlestick Theater. The new book contains an introduction by Sylvan titled "Soft Butch Landing" and an afterword by scholar Miriam Felton-Dansky.



CELINE PARREÑAS SHIMIZU BLENDS ACADEMIA WITH PRACTICE IN NEW PUBLICATIONS; HISTORIAN LECTURES; FILM FESTIVAL PARTICIPATION

Dean Celine Parreñas Shimizu is making waves, not only on campus at TFT, but in the film and academic communities at large. In September, she published two articles online with Amerasia Journal regarding her new film, So To Speak. The **first article** follows the screenplay of the film, in which Morena, a Filipina American college student, uses art to explore the sexualities of herself and other Asian American women. The **second article**, "On So To Speak: Authorship and Authenticity, Collaboration and Community" features a conversation

between Dean Shimizu as director/writer/producer, producer Janet Chen (Ma), and costume designer Pamela Rodríguez Montero, as they explore the film's community-centered production through the lenses of feminist and queer critique.

Additionally, Dean Shimizu was selected for the **Distinguished Lectureship Program** as part of the Organization of American Historians. Her featured lectures include "Making Movies About Asian American Families and Histories Across Generations and Continents;" "The Movies of Racial Childhoods: Screening Asian American Representations of Growing Up;" and more. Finally, Dean Shimizu served as a judge for the documentary feature category of the 20th annual Harlem International Film Fesitval, which ran from September 17-21, 2025.
